Coronations in the United Kingdom



William the Conqueror had his Coronation in Westminster Abbey on Christmas Day in 1066



Charles II's Coronation was the last to take place in Scotland, at Scone Palace in 1651



When do Coronations Happen?

King Charles III acceded to the throne on 8 September 2022

The Coronation will take place on 6 May 2023





The Archbishop of Canterbury



The Archbishop of Canterbury (pictured left) is Justin Welby. He is the most senior cleric in the Church of England.

This will be first coronation of a monarch he has officiated.

As monarch, King Charles III (pictured right) is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England.



A Grand Ceremony

The ceremony will take place at Westminster Abbey, as most coronations have since 1066.





In the past the 260-yearold Gold State Coach has transported the sovereign to the ceremony.


